Council of Hungarian Terminology

The Hungarian language

- Uralic / Finno-Ugric language family
- Agglutinative language
- 10-15 million speakers
- Official language since 1844
- 44 letters in the alphabet

History of Hungarian lexicography

- First multilingual dictionaries that included HU: 16th century
- 1604: first bilingual Latin-Hungarian dict.
- 1862 1874 first monolingual HU dict.
- Largest monolingual reference work: A magyar nyelv értelmező szótára (1959 1962) (Akadémiai Kiadó, Budapest), 7 volumes, 60 000 words (hand dictionary version updated and released in 2003)
- Akadémiai Kiadó published various dictionaries from the 1950s
- Change of the political system in 1989, dictionary publishing became a business

Modern times in HU lexicography

- Over 100 publishing houses
- Dictionary working group of Hungarian Academy of Sciences restarted in 2000 Excellent dictionary award; Series: Lexikográfiai füzetek
- New dictionary types appeared: LSP, learners'
- Certain dictionary types still missing (e.g.: no thesaurus)
- Bilingual translation dictionaries:
- Kis Balázs 2005: EN-HU translation dictionary on IT (several updated, extended editions)
- Fata Ildikó 2005: DE-HU translation dictionary on pension insurance
